

My hope is that these sheets can be a resource for you to think through, plan with, and stay organized for the next few months.




Loans: aid that must be repaid with interest usually starting 6 months after graduation


FAFSA: Free Application for Federal Student Aidthe online application that determines if a student can receive government financial aid
