• Generation E (Entrepreneurship) is a new program this school year, which is available to our students in kindergarten through 12th grade. Gen E has been a phenomenal learning experience for Monroe Middle School students and their teacher, Holly VanKlingeren. Students have the opportunity to create, market, and sell a product, all through an entrepreneurial mindset. Eighth grade student, Jared Schmidt, shared his project, which he is hoping to patent. At Monroe High School, the Gen E curriculum was adopted in the Small Business Ownership class taught by Anne Knabusch. Senior students, Lauren Steve and Lauren McCain, shared the projects they created and sold during the first trimester. They successfully marketed their projects on Etsy, Instagram, and Facebook. Gen E students are encouraged to donate part of their proceeds to a charitable cause. Monroe Middle School

students donated \$65 to Oaks of Righteousness, and students at Monroe High School donated \$200 to Oaks of Righteousness and the Humane Society.

- Our Youth Advisory Council involves MPS students in grades 6-12 who reside in the City of Monroe. Throughout this school year, we have had a partnership with the City of Monroe leaders, and the students have been advocating for things they would like to see available in the City.
