#### For the February 12, 2019 Board of Education Meeting (#3)

• Learning Bank Pass Rate is 95%: Since 2014, when the GED test changed and when the Learning Bank became part of Monroe Public Schools, Vuncia and her team have accomplished a 95% pass rate with 651/688 tests passed. Vuncia believes the average pass rate for those without intervention is around 70.

She shared that a student who needed to pass her math test to be accepted into a nursing program was so excited about her accomplishment that she messaged her at 3 a.m.

• The Monroe Minute Survey Results have been tabulated as of February 11 on curriculum offerings. Based on 375 survey results, STEAM is the most important curriculum offering, with College classes during the school day coming in second and CTE in third. 68% of respondents felt that it was important to teach social and emotional skills like conflict resolution, showing understanding and empathy for others, and being aware of emotions. 38% of Respondents believed that it was somewhat important to provide alternate settings for the delivery of curriculum such as virtual classrooms or online/blended learning.
